The daily programme of the course is based on learning objectives and facilitated by experienced trainers. The training courses promote the initiative and creativity of participants and have a direct impact on their future youth work or youth policy activities, such as organising quality projects and providing intercultural and non-formal learning experiences for young people.

Altogether, **25** people took part in the project.

The overall aim and specific objectives of the project:

To develop entrepreneurial competences in order to apply learning outcomes in their professional work in their organizations and countries.

Within the project, there were 2 youth Mobility Activities:

International training course (6-14 July 2019)

International seminar (11-16 September 2019)

Main contents and activities of the project:

A wide variety of non-formal learning methods was applied which includes individual and group learning, speakers, role-plays, inputs, inter cultural event, group-building, presentations (from the participants and from the trainers), group discussions, simulation games, evaluation. Participants engaged in plenary discussions which followed presentations, workshops. Reflections were every evening.

Among the results of the project are the following:

The project supported youth entrepreneurship and self-employment as key for achieving smart, sustainable and inclusive growth; encouraging cooperation between different sectors; promoted innovation and improve the overall quality of non-formal learning in youth work and youth entrepreneurship;

Der Service Civil International (SCI) ist anerkannter Träger der freien Jugendhilfe gemäß §75 KJHG und veranstaltet internationale Begegnungen im Rahmen von Workcamps. In unseren internationalen Workcamps setzen sich Freiwillige in gemeinnützigen sozialen und ökologischen Projekten für Frieden, gewaltfreie Konfliktlösung, soziale Gerechtigkeit und nachhaltige Entwicklung ein. Neben dem praktischen Arbeitseinsatz gibt es einen Studienteil über die Hintergründe des jeweiligen Projektes.

In Zusammenarbeit mit dem Projekt ist die Campleiterin bei der Vorbereitung und Durchführung des Camps verantwortlich für die Strukturierung des Arbeitseinsatzes, für Programmplanung, Öffentlichkeitsarbeit und Gestaltung des Studienteils.

Wichtiger Bestandteil ihrer Arbeit ist die pädagogische Begleitung der internationalen Gruppe, die Initiierung gruppendynamischer Prozesse und damit verbunden die Förderung eines diversitätsbewussten Lernens. Dabei müssen die unterschiedlichen Voraussetzungen der Teilnehmer*innen, ihre Motivationen und Sprachkenntnisse berücksichtigt und Arbeitsformen gefunden werden, die selbstbestimmtes Lernen in der internationalen Gruppe ermöglichen. Das Zusammenleben, -lernen und -arbeiten selbst ist Bestandteil unserer friedenspädagogischen Konzeption, der die Campleiter*innen in ihrer Funktion und Anleitung zur Selbstorganisation, Konfliktregelung und Eigeninitiative im Camp Rechnung tragen müssen.

Zur Qualifizierung der Campleiter*innen führt der SCI mehrtägige Vorbereitungsseminare durch. Anschließend bereiten die Campleiter*innen eigenständig ihr Camp inhaltlich, organisatorisch und methodisch vor. Hierzu gehört auch ein Projektbesuch mit Vorbesprechung beim Projektpartner. Nach Beendigung der Campsaison führt der SCI ein Seminar für alle Campleiter*innen zur Aufarbeitung und Auswertung der Erfahrungen durch.
